

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

GENERAL INFORMATION

The scholarship fund was established by the American Public Works Association, Texas Chapter and was created to provide scholarships for higher education (college graduate and undergraduate). It is the goal of the Chapter to award several \$1,000 higher education scholarships. Scholarship awards are contingent upon funding availability.

ELIGIBILITY

To apply for a higher education scholarship from the Texas Chapter, you must:

Be enrolled as a full-time student (12+hours) in an undergraduate or (9+hours) in a graduate

degree program. **OR**

Be an active student member* enrolled as a part-time student (3+hours) in an undergraduate or higher degree program.

OR

Be a high school student in your senior year.

* An active student member of APWA is defined as a member that has paid their membership prior to the date of scholarship application and attends a minimum of 1 activity per year.

ADMINISTRATION

Applications for the higher education scholarship must be received early enough to allow time for review and presentation of the award prior to the fall college semester. The scholarship committee will present the scholarship recipient the award in August after verification has been confirmed. The scholarship will be paid in one installment. Payment will be contingent upon the recipient providing proof of registration. Satisfactory completion shall be further defined as receiving, at a minimum, a passing grade in each course completed. Students falling below these minimum requirements will not receive future scholarships.

SELECTION FOR STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

A specific course of study that offers a career field in public service or other public sector career is required to apply. Examples of technical expertise may include but are not limited to:

- Emergency Management
- Engineering and Technology
- Facilities and Grounds
- Fleet Services
- Leadership and Management
- Solid Waste Management
- Transportation
- Utility & Public Right-of-Way
- Water Resources Management

Applicants will be selected on the basis of academic achievement, course of study, career goals, community service, financial need and letter of recommendation. The weighting of selection criteria follows.

- 10% Completeness of the application
- 30% Public works career field/career goals
- 20% Academic achievement
- 15% Community service
- 25% Financial need/letter of recommendation/sponsor
